This website is run by Colan Parish Council. We want as many people as possible to be able to use this website. For example, that means you should be able to:

- change colours, contrast levels and fonts

Non-accessible content

The content listed below is non-accessible for the following reasons.

Non-compliance with the accessibility regulations

 Many of our older PDFs documents don't meet accessibility standards - for example, they may not be structured so they're accessible to a screen reader. <u>See WCAG 2.1 success criterion 4.1.2</u> (name, role value). This fails WCAG 2.1 success criterion 1.1.1 (non-text content). • Some images do not have a text alternative, so people using a screen reader cannot access the information. This fails WCAG 2.1 success criterion 1.1.1 (non-text content).

When we publish new content we'll make sure our use of images meets accessibility standards.

When we publish new content, we'll make sure our use of images and PDFs meets accessibility standards.

Disproportionate burden

Navigation and accessing information

- There's no way to skip the repeated content in the page header (for example, a 'skip to main content' option).
- It's not always possible to change the device orientation from horizontal to vertical without making it more difficult to view the content.
- It's not possible for users to change text size without some of the content overlapping.

We've assessed the cost of fixing the issues with navigation and accessing information, and with interactive tools and transactions. We believe that doing so now would be a <u>disproportionate burden</u> within the meaning of the accessibility regulations. We will make another assessment when the supplier contract is up for renewal, likely to be in 12 months.

What we're doing to improve accessibility

We plan to improve accessibility on this website by:

- regularly monitoring the accessibility of our website
- making our PDF documents (created after 22nd February 2023) as accessible as possible
- where possible, creating HTML pages rather than PDF documents
- We plan to add text alternatives for all images by September 2020.
 When we publish new content we'll make sure our use of images meets accessibility standards.

Content that's not within the scope of the accessibility regulations

PDFs and other documents

Some of our PDFs are essential to providing our services. For example, we have PDFs with information on how users can access our services.

The accessibility regulations do not require us to fix PDFs or other documents published before 22 February 2023 if they're not essential to providing our services.

Any new PDFs we publish will meet accessibility standards.
