Your County Councillor John Fitter writes...

Greetings dear reader of the Colan Companion.

Is it not wonderful that we now have truly left the grip of winter behind us as we continue to march in the direction of summer? I suspect we are all delighted to enjoy these longer daylight hours, which gives us more time to carry out those outside jobs that one has been putting off all the winter, or just the opportunity to relax outside and enjoy the evening sun. Well, that is the wish, let's hope we have the summer weather to go with it.

The Cornwall Council Cabinet is reeling from the feedback on the public consultation which indicated that over 60% of residents here in Cornwall did not want a change of Governance to that of having a Mayor for Cornwall. The residents, rightly in my view, did not consider that this style of administration was right for Cornwall. At a special meeting of the Cabinet they voted not to proceed, while still claiming that they were correct and indeed making the suggestion that the silent majority supported them! I do wonder sometimes on what planet the Cabinet members are on, and of course if they felt that the so called silent majority were indeed supporting them they had the option of putting it to a referendum. I will leave you, the dear reader, to decide why they rejected that route.

At the April Cornwall Council meeting, two motions were put down for discussions, the first one was a motion called Meaningful Devolution for Cornwall. It was proposed by Councillor Cole and seconded by Councillor Jenkins. The core message in the motion, if approved, was that Cornwall Council resolve to inform

the U.K Government that we wish to commence negotiations for a more meaningful devolution settlement, similar to those enjoyed in other Celtic parts of the U.K {such as a national Assembly of Cornwall or Cornish Parliament. This motion had cross party support, but was opposed by the Conservative group. My position was quite clear, I am proud to be a Cornishman and strongly support an increase in a range of powers being devolved to Cornwall, but this is not the way to do it. We have already had one fiasco where the Council spent 18 months in negotiations with Central Government without first establishing with the people of Cornwall what sort of deal they would support, with the result that Central Government must be questioning whatever is going on. We must first of all ask the people what sort of devolution that would have their majority support, we must offer various models of the sort of powers we wish to take on and we must paint the picture of what is involved, warts and all, and only then (when we have a consensus of a majority view) can our Officers then go to Central Government and make the case for a true devolution based upon the wishes of the people, and not out the cart before the horse as has been the case thus far. The motion was defeated and my hope is now that all the party leaders will get together and start to prepare a program of various models of devolutions for the people of Cornwall to consider, and if the will is there form a collative view.

The second motion was to support the principles of the Climate and Ecology Bill which will be reintroduced in







the House of Commons on May 10th. I do believe that every one who cares about the ecological and climate emergency will wish this bill every success in its efforts to require the U.K Government to produce a joined up approach to climate and nature strategy, and to ensure the UK's environmental response is in line with the latest science.

I was delighted to fund, from my community money, the purchase of some solar panels and the kit required for installing them for the use of the Colan Garden Society.

Hi All, are you keeping everything crossed for warmer weather? Perhaps by the time you are reading this we finally have proper spring weather. But at the time of writing it's rainy, cold and windy, and only the very hardy allotters have sown seeds in the ground.

We held our AGM end of March, and the committee was re-elected. We discussed grant applications, and would like to thank John Fitter for money towards improving our site. Anything we need to buy needs to be funded by grants, as our member fees are used to pay for insurance, allotment association membership, website, tool maintenance/repairs, fuel and site repairs. After the winter our driveway needed some repairs, and thanks to Glanville's (St Columb Major) driver, and a good turn out of allotters, the gravel ordered, was spread out in flash.

Lots of people have commented on the positive vibe there is on our site. The majority is a friendly bunch, and usually there is time for a natter, discuss growing methods or just a "how are you?" The openness of the site with the sea in the distance is just so calming. You soon forget the traffic sounds, though the train's hoot always brings a smile. Having an allotment is not just about growing lots of stuff, but also the escape from work or home, and a chance to recharge both mentally and physically.
