Your County Councillor John Fitter writes...

Greetings dear readers of the Colan Companion.

I hope that your festive season is all that you would wish for and I take this opportunity to wish you a happy and peaceful new year.

This is now the last full year of the current administration at County Hall, with the Cornwall Council elections due to be held in May 2025. With, of course, a General Election to come before, the latest date for that would be January 2025, however informed opinion suggesting it will be held in the Autumn. So that most of this year will, I suppose, be election talk with the Tories and Labour exchanging blows in the race to Number 10. Mind you, as I write this in early December, it would seem to be Labour out in front, and as an independent I hold no brief for either of them, my only wish is that whoever gets the keys to Number 10, they will start to sort out the appalling mess that this nation has drifted into over the last five years. As ever it will be in the hands of the great British public, some might say those who got us in this mess should stay and clean it up while others might say enough is enough and time to change the guard.

Over the last year I have continued to serve on three planning committees, they are planning Committee East, Central Planning and the Strategic Planning Committee. I continue to serve on the Inshore Fishery and Conservation Authority where I am Vice Chairman. I am a member of the Transport Appeals panel, I also serve as member on the Cornwall Country Access Panel Forum and the Standing Advisory Council Religious Education. In addition to these duties I continue to deal with and address where possible the problems, concerns of residents who live in my division.

I am attempting to understand what the effect will be on Quintrell Downs if the Cornwall Cabinet decide to go ahead with the Mid Cornwall Metro, which is supposed to give us a rail link from Newquay to Falmouth. Regretfully, at the time of writing I am still trying to establish what benefits will come, and have a feeling it is another vanity project where the chance to have so called

'free money' from Central Government must be seized regardless of the down side. Memories of the fiasco of the Saints Trail and the cost of that failed project come to mind, and that was so called free money. It could be an overall benefit but robust scrutiny must be carried out on this project, especially on the ongoing cost implications should the build out of the project overrun the time line given by Central Government, or the service does not get the numbers projected. Both of which will mean costs falling back on the ratepayer, that is you or I.

As many will be aware, the Boardmasters Management Group are asking to increase their permitted numbers by an increase of 5000 ticket holders for this August 2024, and a further 5000 for the 2025 event. Last year 2023 there were massive traffic problems along with other off site issues, and my view is that it would be helpful to get these issues addressed and sorted before consideration is given for the number increase that is being applied for. It is expected that the application to increase the numbers will go before the licensing panel in January or February when the decision will be made.

At the current time the building schedule for the N.S.R is proceeding more or less according to plans, with completion expected late this year or early next year.

After it is opened, consultation will begin on closing access to vehicles crossing the Trent Creek and Chapel rail crossings. If the closing is approved it will certainly put a stop to the naughty people who still insist on using the Chapel road as a cut through, despite the fact there is a restriction on this practise, access being restricted to residents and people on business connected with the community at Chapel.

Police Crime Report for the Colan area

No crime patterns or incidents which would affect day to day living, a couple of drink drivers stopped on the main roads around Quintrell.

Op MONTANA is the national response to distraction burglaries. The Home Office definition of a distraction burglary is:

"Any crime where a falsehood, trick or distraction is used on an occupant of a dwelling to gain, or try to gain, access to the premises to commit burglary. It includes cases where the offender first enters the premises and subsequently uses distraction burglary methods in order to remain on the premises and/or gain access to other parts of the premises in order to commit burglary."

Doorstep crime is the name given to crimes carried out by bogus callers and rogue traders who call uninvited at your home under the guise of legitimate business or trade. The phrase 'doorstep crime' includes distraction burglary, bogus callers, rogue traders and unscrupulous salespeople.

- Bogus callers These people may trick you into giving them money or your personal details.
- Rogue traders These people offer to do work for you, but then overcharge you for poor or incomplete work.
- Aggressive sellers In some cases aggressive selling is a criminal offence.
- Distraction burglars One person keeps you occupied at the front door while another person goes around the back and enters your property without you knowing.
- Courier and telephone fraud (see OP RADIUM) although this offence may start with a phone call the 'courier' element will result in someone attending the premises to

relieve the victim of their cash or escort them to a cashpoint to obtain the cash.

Most people who knock on your door or ring your doorbell are genuine, but some are not. A friendly face and a warm smile are not always what they seems. Always be on your guard. To combat doorstep crime the police work in partnership with Trading Standards.

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO SAY NO – IF YOU ARE NOT CONTENT - DO NOT SIGN OR AGREE TO ANY WORK. Ask the caller to return when you have a friend or family member present. Consumer Advice have information to support those that inadvertently agree or sign up to what is retrospectively considered unwanted work – as long as it is within the statutory 'cooling off' period.

Questions:

- Has the person entered your home?
- Is the suspect still in the area?
- Description of the person?
- Vehicle VRM and description (any trade name logo/ telephone number)

If you have any suspicions and the traders are at your or your neighbours home please ring 999 or if you hear of any potential rogue trader activity please ring '101'

First early potatoes can be planted as early as February, as long as there is a bit of protection on cold nights. And they will be ready to eat in May.

It's also the right time to start off some seeds on a window sill or in a greenhouse. Our potting shed will be useful to start seeds early, so fingers crossed the weather will be kind to us and temperatures not too low.




In a new little feature suggested by Sarah, we thought it would be nice to reminisce about old times in Quintrell Downs. I think I'll call it 'When I was lad...'


