Your County Councillor John Fitter writes...

Greetings dear readers of your own Colan Companion.

Well bit of a funny old summer thus far, sort of hit and miss weather wise perhaps it will become more settled when we get to September, mind you nothing is ever certain and I suspect you are like me, you take it all in your stride, nothing we can do about it.

A hot topic at Cornwall Council is the latest ask by the ruling group on their vision for a devolution deal that they would like Central Government to deliver to Cornwall. The deputy Prime minister has asked all regions and Authorities wishing to seek greater powers by using the devolution route, to submit their requests to central Government for consideration. The Government plans for the English Devolution Bill were introduced in the Kings speech on July 17th.

The Council have published their white paper on what they would like which will be considered by the Cabinet on September 18th. I personally find it a matter of regret that full Council will not be asked to endorse or reject the final version which they the cabinet will vote on, surely it would have more democratic status if it was subjected to the voice of the entire elected members, however the current administration don't take kindly to what could be a different view to what they deem is the way forward for Cornwall and the next administration which will be formed in May 2025.

One thing at the current time that is missing and indeed was in the first draft, but after objections from a Cabinet Member was removed, was the ability for Cornwall to have the opportunity to introduce a Tourist Levy/tax, if this was to be considered and brought in a levy of £1 to £3 per night would raise between 20 to 63 Million pounds a year which could be spent on a range of things that would improve the Visitor experience as well as helping to improve the image that we project to the rest of the U.K, just think of the extra spend we could put into our road budget, our coastal and inland footpath network much loved by locals as well as our visitors are crying out for urgently required improvements, but there is no money left in the kitty to do these extra urgent jobs. Another ask

could be to have the power, if again it was needed at any time in the future, and that is to levy a 300% Council Tax on second homes.

As soon as the Cabinet have voted on the final document which will take place on September 18th I will certainly update you, mind you as we all remember the old saying, asking does not mean that you get.

Another subject that is shrouded in secrecy is the Privatisation of Cornwall Airport, what we know is that the Cabinet is engaged in secret talks/negotiations to do a deal with a company called Adynation Asset,the critical part of the deal that has come out so far is that for the next 10 years this new very senior partner will pay off each year the subsidy that is currently required to run the airport. The subsidy paid by the ratepayer for last year was over 4 million, and forecast to be for this year ending on March 31st 2025 to be even greater them the amount for this year, nearer £5 million is being forecasted.

Back benchers have never been given sight of any of the figures of how the airport management are managing to achieve this sort of deficit. The management rightly proudly boast that passenger numbers are now above pre covid level and yet the operation in business terms is broke, questions do need answering, these have been asked but answers there are none. And how does this Farther Christmas who is coming to the rescue the Airport going to manage to make a profit on their investment if they are burdened with this growing subsidy. What will they be building on this 650 acre estate, remembering of course that the airport estate has a local development order which means that much of what they will wish to do can be done without having to submit tiresome planning applications which would be open to inspection, and dare one say objection, perish the thought that the community might have a view or even be allowed to express it. More news on this unfolding drama in the next edition of the Companion.

Summer is slowly coming to a close and the allotters are busy harvesting.

Most of our plots are being worked hard, and it is great to see our newer members really getting stuck in. The old saying "you reap what you sow" is literally true in a garden or allotment. The more effort you put in, the bigger the reward. And if you don't put much effort in, it becomes an uphill struggle just keeping up with unwanted weeds. Many allotters also know that regular attendance ensures you can harvest your crops at the optimum time. Nothing worse than veg that has bolted or beans that have become overripe and tough. Never mind the courgettes that have become marrows!

Last but not least, the harvest has to be processed when you take it home. Peas need podding, some go into the freezer and some eaten straight away. Pickling, freezing and canning is very satisfying if you have the time. And time is the most important aspect of commitment in having a successful allotment.

Our pond project is going well. Thanks to dedicated and clever people it is really looking nice. When the old pond was removed a number of frogs were relocated, but hopefully they will relocate to the new pond to spawn in the spring. New pond plants are settling in, but will take a while to establish. The area around the pond has been landscaped, and a low fence build around the area. Police Crime Report for the Colan area

As the nights draw in, we sometimes, (not always) see a rise in Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB).

ASB is taken seriously by local police, and I have seen its effect on areas and individuals. It is essential to report ASB if issues are affecting the quality of life to you or residents.

We have a fair number of methods to deal with ASB, from words of advice to criminal prosecution.

If there are multiple reports in the same area and involve the same issue, we would likely create a Problem-Solving Plan also known as problem-oriented policing. It's an approach to tackling crime and disorder that involves:

- Identification of a specific problem
- Thorough analysis to understand the problem
- Development of a tailored response
- Assessment of the effects of the response

The approach assumes that identifying and understanding the root causes of a problem – or conditions that allow it to continue – leads to an effective solution.

We use the **SARA** model, which has four stages,

Scanning- the cause of the harm, ASB, the call for police attention.

Analysis- how the problem is progressing, where and when. The harm it generates. This will come in as intelligence and reports, such as police logs.

Response- this could be increased patrols, hard targeting, partner agencies, such as the ASB case workers in the council, Fire brigade and housing authorities, but to name a few.

Assessment- we review whether the actions have worked, problem has been removed, reduced, or unintentionally aggravated.

In other words, we like to know what's going on. In my experience engagement and a visible presence can be effective in dealing with ASB.


I have had a look at the crime and incidents over the last month regarding Colon, no crime trends, or consistent issues that I can see.


